What does that mean? Interpreting behaviour

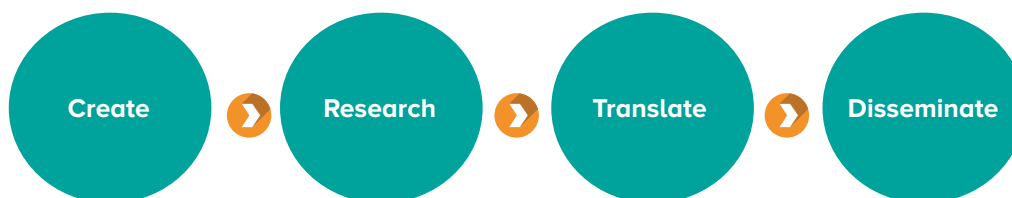
A presentation that explores all things ‘behaviour’ and how to work out what to do.
