







Seeking Autistic Children Can wearing a sensory vest support anxiety?

Help us find out!

Many autistic children have trouble processing sensory information, and this can make it difficult for them to regulate everyday behaviour. Specialised clothing has been developed to help keep the sensory system calm, but we don't know if it may help children manage anxiety.

We need the help of autistic children and their parents to test the effects of a sensory vest.

Who can participate?

Children who:

- ✓ have a diagnosis of autism
- ✓ have anxiety and sensory problems
- ✓ are aged 8-12 years, and
- ✓ not currently using sensory clothing

What is involved?

Your participation in this study will last for **4 months total** and includes:

- 5 in-person visits (parent and child) at CliniKids (Perth: Subiaco or Joondalup)
- Online parent surveys (repeated over time)
- Parent completing a regular diary on their phone

There will be two groups for this study, and children in each group will be given vests to **wear for 3 months of the study**.

Children will be randomly allocated to either the:

- Treatment group (children receive the sensory vest)
- Placebo group (children receive the placebo vest)
